





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- ➤ What is Predictive Modeling?
 - Analyze the Past & Predict the Future
 - Construct an attrition modeling using 3-YR FR cohort information;
 - Run the current FR cohort & assign each Freshman an attrition probability & which an attrition group he/she belongs.

Fostering Student Success

(UNC Policy 400.1.5)

- Section 3 Establish student success and support structure to review and issue reports on:
 - > Retention, progression, graduation, and time to degree
 - > Course scheduling of required courses
 - ➤ Grade requirements for general education and their impact on time to degree
 - > Academic advising system and its impact on time to degree

FUSS Regulations

(UNC Policy 400.1.5[R])

- ➤ Advising Campuses shall develop policies to monitor the availability of appropriate and timely academic advising, particularly for first-time undergraduates and first-semester transfer students to:
 - Assist students in making effective academic and career decisions,
 - ➤ Increase the potential for students selecting appropriate courses and schedules,
 - Provide students with assistance in selecting a major in a timely fashion,
 - Prevent excessive changes of major,
 - Increase students' awareness of an appropriate course load and academic assistance available to them, and
 - Provide information as appropriate on course selection and the impact on tuition surcharge.

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FUSS Regulations

(UNC Policy 400.1.5[R])

- ➤ Early Warning System Each campus will have an early warning system (EWS) to alert relevant campus personnel to signs of poor academic performance by a student or of behavior likely to lead to a student not making Satisfactory Academic Progress.
 - > HAWK Alert Program

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FUSS Guidelines

(UNC Policy 400.1.5[G])

- >EWS will identify students experiencing or at risk of academic difficulty.
- >EWS will monitor
 - First time freshmen and transfers
 - > Sophomores
 - > Student athletes
 - Students not in good academic standing
 - Readmit students returning from a suspension or on probation
 - At-risk populations as determined by the campus

FUSS Guidelines

(UNC Policy 400.1.5[G])

- ➤ Requires one alert be sent each semester no later than the 3rd week of the classes.
- Chief academic officers, deans, and department chairs are responsible for ensuring the faculty and other relevant campus personnel comply with the EWS.
