III Approval of Minutes

IV. Chair report

A. Dr. Denny provided an update from the FIAC meeting as well as more information related Digital Measures. UNCP did not purchase the function of Digital Measures that could support electronic portfolios. Digital Measures does have a system for faculty to track scholarship, teaching, and service.

V. Old Business

Members reported on their investigations of electronic portfolios of schools throughout the North Carolina system. According to member reports, all schools use paper-based portfolios except for the following schools: UNC-Charlotte, NCSU, and UNC-Wilmington. This is the first year for electronic portfolios at UNC-Wilmington. All colleges with electronic portfolios use a homegrown system supported by their Division of Information Technology.

Members recalled the lack of enthusiasm by UNCP's Division of Information Technology as it related to a homegrown solution for a university-wide electronic portfolio system.

VI. New Business

Members will provide feedback on Dr. Denny's report addressed to FIAC as it relates to the subcommittee's decision to discontinue our efforts to transfer from paper-based to electronic portfolios due to our research findings in addition to logistical, security, and financial concerns.
