

Enrollment Trend: Fall 2000 - Fall 2019










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

Conclusions

- ➤ Academic Performance in HS and first term are the key for student success
 - DFW rate
 - Difference between Attempted and Earned SCH
 - Fall Term GPA
- >Students from county tier 3 had positive impact on first-year retention, but not on six-year graduation
- > Student from low income families
