Appendix A: Notes from Student Affairs:

Projects:

- The Office of Student Inclusion and Diversity's physical space is being revamped, refreshed, and reorganized to better serve needs of the office and students (e.g., fresh paint, new furniture, student lounge).
- Furniture has been chosen for the Pine Hall upgrade for summer 2020. Bids have been placed for other upgrades to Pine Hall.
- Aquatic Center elevator is being replaced and is currently off-line. Disability Services has been in the process and the timeline is mid-April for replacement.

New Hires/Accolades:

- Jaelyn Wynn – Assistant Director of Health Promotion, Student Health Services (Effective March 2)
- Altmann Locklear – Administrative Support Associate, UCP

Current Vacancies:

- 1) Assistant Director for Inclusive Education – Webex interviews conducted

- 3) Campus Police Officer – Police and Public Safety

Collaboration in Division:

- The Career Center partnered with JCPenney on February 9th for the JCPenney Suit-Up Event, in which 110 students participated.
- PPS will partner with Starbucks for coffee with a cop events for students. These events will provide more opportunities for officers to interact with students in a relaxed setting. The most recent Coffee with a Cop took place on February 12.
- Environmental Health and Safety hosted the first in a series of five dates for information tables in the UC to educate students on the Livesafe App and various other Safety initiatives on campus.

Miscellaneous:

- Housing selection for returning students officially kicked off on January 27th, which allows students to begin the online housing application process by filling out their housing agreement and roommate form. The first date to select a room began on February 3rd when upperclassmen were able to reclaim their current housing space. Thus far, over 300 students have reclaimed their room for next year.
- In February, CAPS will be the 8th UNC System school to utilize Protocall—a 24/7 crisis counseling phone line to support students after hours and other times as needed. This will enhance services for students and support other after hours staff such as Police and Public Safety and Housing and Residence Life.
- In Fall 2019, CAPS served 502 students. The top 4 concerns seen in CAPS were anxiety (63%), stress (60%), depression (57%), and academic performance. CAPS increased their show rate by 14% and students are attending more sessions on average. Two psychiatric providers served 169 students in one semester compared to last year serving 121 students.
- Friday Night Lights – Free play to all students with a valid Braves ID in the Hawks Nest on the 2nd Friday of each month.
