 - iii. LTI Issues: We need to establish a request deadline (or at least publicize a clear timeframe) so faculty understand that requests for Canvas integrations typically take several weeks to investigate and

approve. Should we have a more formalized protocol for approving the requests as a committee? And a clear plan for summer requests? Should our approval process delve more deeply into content of the tools (especially regarding potential overlap?)—right now main discussion is about security and accessibility.

 - § This would break our current automation with dropping and adding students back into the correct A/B section. Not so much dropping but adding would be difficult.
 - § Is it worth the development time? Is this only for one more semester or should we consider this longer term?
 - § Should these sections be defined in Banner as true A/B sections?
 - o Assuming that the Hypothesis LTI is approved, some of the functionality of Hypothesis seems to duplicate functionality in Perusall. Should we select one?
 - o Organizationally we want to combine the Summer terms into one big Summer term in Canvas.

- o Can we establish a cutoff date for LTI requests prior to the start of a term?
