
<u>Who is a Mandatory Reporter?</u> Officials w/Authority, Mandated Reporters (formerly Responsible Employees), & Campus Security Authorities

Who is a Title IX Official with Authority or Mandated Reporter (formerly Responsible Employee)? Who is a Clery Act Campus Security Authority?



Mandatory Reporters must report sexual misconduct offenses they are aware of to the Office of Title IX and Clery Compliance (not to campus police unless it is the desire of the Complainant) no matter where the offense occurred - on or off campus.

Specifically, CSAs must report specific crimes (non-sexual offenses) to UNCP Police and Public Safety (901.521.6235) if they occurred on UNCP's Clery geography. All sexual crimes and offenses must be reported to the Office of Title IX and Clery Compliance.

Reporting forms are on the Office of Title IX and Clery Compliance (TIXCC) webpage and the Police and Public Safety webpage.

Clery Geography:

The location of the Clery crime is important information to collect. The Clery act requires disclosure for crimes that happen

- on campus (to include residence halls),
- on public property within or immediately adjacent to the campus (e.g., public streets), and
- in or on non-campus buildings or property that UNCP owns or controls.
 (e.g., the Regional Center, Incubator)

Property that is "controlled" by the university means that we rent or lease it, or we have some sort of written agreement (even an informal one) that says we may use it. (e.g., student overnight stays in hotels)
