1. SACL Chair

- a. Grad student now being represented SACL: Oluyemi Stephens

2. Chair, Student Publications Board (Jamie Litty)

- a. Jamie- yearbooks were shipped to students in late August, and others arrived on Campus mid-September.

- a. Gender neutral restrooms update: K. Pierce left Facilities last Friday and helped determine the potential for these on campus; We have a long list of gender-neutral restrooms for campus, and we're in the final stages of approval.

 - a. Jamie brings up that many sections do not know midterm grades, so it's hard to know what they need to take in the Spring 2023.
 - b. Brian brings up that we have no professor names or classroom numbers listed yet.
 - c. All agree that there are some issues with this that bring confusion and possible for issues arise in scheduling and registration.
 - d. Jamie says we will not see professors listed until there are enough students for the class to make (8?) and Matt agrees that this is problematic
 - e. Jamie says that Enrollment Management should be more involved with this.
 - f. We would like SGA's input on this, but they aren't represented at today's meeting.

Peter brings up that Renee L. mentioned that we might want to talk about mental health training the Board of Governors has talked about improving mental health mentors; so do we see any mental health issues that students are showing?  - Camille mentions that it's tough when we have so many online students to assess this with those students -; how do we reach out to or assess them for mental health struggles? She's concerned about some of our graduate students moving forward.
 - Jamie brings up that we might bring on someone from the Graduate School to see what their plan for mental health services and outgroup are. We might ask someone from CAPS to come to our meeting to address this.
 - Brian brings up that it would be nice to know what the specific issues or alerts might look like for online students.
 - Camille mentions that it would be nice to have a Hawk Alert type thing for graduate students that's universal.
 - Peter will ask around about this.

- Hawk's Nest Renovations: Repainted, resurface pool tables, new nostalgic video game systems, air hockey added
- E-Sports Arena: Latest technology, gaming desks and chairs, UNCP branding, LED Lighting
- New bowling alley scoring system scheduled to install over the winter holiday
- F45 Studio is now in operation. F45 has virtual sign-on capabilities for off-campus and online student usage. Over 484 classes will be offered over the 2022-23 calendar year.
- New lobby and lounge furniture has been added to Pine, Belk, Cypress and North Halls
- North Hall has received lobby and lounge cosmetic updates

Collaboration in Division:

- Milkshake Mondays: began August 29. Will be held throughout the semester on the last Monday of each month from 11:30 a.m. – 1:30 p.m. in the Chavis Student Center. During this event, staff will check-in with students and distribute milkshakes in SA branded cups.

- The Career Center and Community and Civic Engagement partnered to host the Part-time Job and Volunteer fair on Friday, August 19. The fair hosted 15 employers and 9 community partners and engaged approximately 230 students.
- Student Affairs offered 11 workshops throughout the summer on topics related to Wellness, UNCP Policies and Procedures, Brave Connect, Handshake, Building Academic Partnerships, Team building, Performance Planning, and Identifying Grants. In addition, we offered ALICE Training and deliberative dialogue training to all staff during Braves Kickoff.

Miscellaneous:

- UNCP was approved for the new COVID-19 Bivalent Booster. This is expected to be available in September.
- Community and Civic Engagement has been successfully awarded the 2022 Ask Every Student Grant. This grant will help support democratic engagement on campus through the UNCP Students Learn Students Vote Initiative. The grant was awarded in the amount of \$4,000.00
- SHS presented to all of the community directors on August 2, providing timely updates on Covid protocol and Monkeypox awareness.
- Abdul Ghaffar is leading the Student Advisory Board for Student Affairs. This board will consist of 15 students who can assist as a focus group and will meet once a month.
- Student Tuition & Fee Process will begin soon, once the memo is received from the UNC System. Student Affairs will work in conjunction with Finance & Administration to complete this process.

Programming:

- CCE will host the annual Candle Light Vigil in honor September 11th on 9/14 at the UNCP Amphitheater.
- Virtual Career Panels will kick-off in September with the first session being on Monday, September 19. Dr. Jeff Bolles will moderate this session with alumni panelists to discuss their career journeys. The second panel will take place on Wednesday September 21 and will be moderated by Dr. Rebekah Revels Lowry.
- The Career Center will host the Fall 2022 Health and Human Services Recruiting Event on Monday, September 12 at 1:00 pm in the UC Annex. This event is focused on nursing, mental health counseling, social work, school counseling, etc.
- The Career Center will host the Fall 2022 Education Fair on Tuesday, September 20 at 11:30 am-2:00 pm in UC Annex. This event will host at least 25 school systems from across the state.
- Collegiate Challenge Kickoff is scheduled for September 26. This event in partnership with Food Lion is a competition that will include food drive and MVP Card competition.
- Mobile Career Services will continue this fall with the first session being on Thursday, September 1st from 3-5 pm in the library. This session will be followed by one in Einstein's on Wednesday, September 7 from 12-2 pm and Starbucks on Monday, September 19 from 9-11 am.
- SHS will partner with Phi Sigma Nu to host the quarterly blood drive on September 15, 2022
