



## Assistant Professor in Professional School Counseling

The University of North Carolina at Pembroke is a state university located in southeastern NC which has a tenure-track position in the Mental Health and School Counseling Program at the Assistant Professor level. The Mental Health and School Counseling Program prepares master's degree practitioners for both school and community settings.

Responsibilities include teaching graduate courses and supervising practicum and internships. Quality teaching, scholarship and service are expected and the desire to work in tandem with faculty to contribute to a vision of growth; and a willingness to provide a student-centered approach with prior experience working with/teaching a diverse student body. Heavy emphasis is on evening and online instruction. Additional duties include student advisement and mentoring, serving on program, department, college, and university committees, service to public schools and scholarly activity.

Qualifications: The candidate will have an earned doctorate (by time of appointment) in counselor education or closely related field; evidence of, or potential for, expertise in master's-level teaching in core curriculum to include clinical supervision; experience in counseling settings; leadership and team skills; evidence of, or promise for, scholarship.
