What programs are offered on Fort Bragg?

UNCP currently offers 3 undergraduate and 4 graduate degree programs on Fort Bragg.

Undergraduate Programs

- Bachelor of Science in Nursing (RN-BSN)
- Bachelor of Arts in Criminal Justice
- Bachelor of Science in Business Administration (Management)

Graduate Programs

- Master of Business Administration (MBA)
- Master of Arts in Physical Education: Sports Administration
- Master of Public Administration (MPA)
- Master of Arts in Teaching (MAT)
 - Middle Grades Education Specialization
 - Physical Education Specialization
 - Secondary Mathematics Education (grades 9-12)
 - Secondary Social Studies Education (grades 9 - 12)

What are the admissions requirements? Students must complete a UNCP application for admission, pay a \$45 nonrefundable application fee, submit an official high school transcript, official college transcripts and any other documents that may lead to additional transfer credits (AARTS, DD214, CLEP results, etc). Transfer students must have a CGPA of 2.0, submit a University Questionnaire and meet minimum course requirements or be 24 years or older.

Graduate students must complete a UNCP application for admission, pay a \$45 non-refundable application fee, submit official college transcripts, submit MAT, GRE, or GMAT scores and letters of recommendation. Do I have to have an Associates degree before entering the university? No. However, due to state requirements, UNCP is not allowed to offer 1000 and 2000 level classes on Fort Bragg. Therefore, students can take these classes online with UNCP or acquire these classes elsewhere. We recommend that students contact our office for an unofficial evaluation.

Do I have to take the ACT/SAT? Transfer students who have completed 30 credit hours of college credit or who are 21 years old do not have to take the ACT/SAT.

What is the cost of tuition? Rates are subject to change without notice. The following tuition rates apply to both the Fort Bragg and online classes.

Where do I find a class schedule? Current class schedules are available at www.uncp.edu/ced. You may also stop by UNCP's Fort Bragg office located in the EArmyU Building, 2-1105, on the corner of Reilly Rd and Macomb St on Fort Bragg, or email fort.bragg@uncp.edu.

How do I register for classes? Students will need to apply and be accepted to UNCP before they are allowed to register for classes. Once accepted, registration takes place online through BraveWeb. You may contact UNCP's Fort Bragg office for assistance.

How do I pay for classes? Students pay for class at the time of registration. All military students are eligible for Tuition Assistance (TA). Military Tuition Assistance covers 100% of UNCP's tuition. Army students must request TA through GoArmyEd and Air Force students through the Air Force Virtual Education Center. Military members stationed at a military installation in NC and their dependents are eligible for the in-state tuition rate, which will be assessed following the completion and submission of the Military Waiver Form.

What other forms of financial aid are available? Federal financial aid and NC scholarships are available to UNCP students. Individuals needing financial aid should contact the Office of Financial Aid at 910-521-6255 or fa@uncp.edu.

How long are distance education terms? UNCP offers two 8 to 10 week terms during the fall and spring semesters and 5 or 10 week terms during the summer on Fort Bragg. Most classes usually meet in the classroom one night per week. Classes are also available online for the Business and RN-BSN undergraduate programs and the Physical Education, Teaching, and Public Administration masters programs. Online terms are 16 weeks long.

How long are the classes? Most undergraduate classes meet for 2-3 hours, once or twice a week. Most of the graduate classes meet for 4-5 hours once a week. Some of our classes are in a hybrid format (a combination of classroom and online).

Do I have to be in the military to take classes with UNCP at Fort Bragg? No. Classes at Fort Bragg are open to all. However, students must be able to access Fort Bragg.

What UNCP services are available to me? Students have access to services at UNCP's Main Campus, the distance education library, online bookstore, and Braveweb - the online registration and student accounts system. UNCP students can take classes at any UNCP site, which includes the Main Campus in Pembroke, Richmond Community College, and Sandhills Community College.
