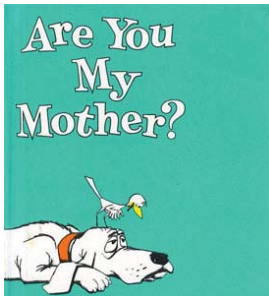

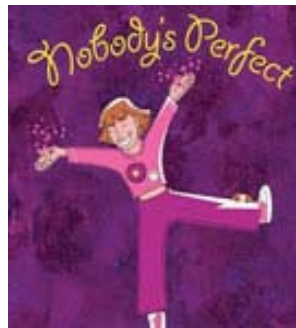
NC Symphony

Tickets are sold on a first come, first served basis. Please reserve in advance to ensure seating. If you cannot attend a performance, please call the box office to cancel your reservation at least two weeks prior to the scheduled performance.
