Proposals from the Department of Health, P.E. and Recreation

5.1 Program Modification: Modify the Exercise and Sport Science program in the following ways: Add new 3-hr PED 4030 Facilities Design in HPER as a program requirement and decrease program electives from 26 to 23 (approved by Department 35-0-0).

Rationale: Modification will strengthen the degree.

5.2 Program Modification: Modify the Recreation Management/Administration Program in the following ways: Add new 3-hr PED 4030 Facilities Design in HPER as a program requirement and decrease program electives from 26 to 23 (approved by Department 35-0-0).

Rationale: Course is recommended by national recreation accreditation association.

5.3 New Course: Add new 3-hr PED 4030 Facilities Design In HPER and require it in both the REC & EXSS degree programs (approved by Department 35-0-0).

Course Prefix & Number: PED 4030

Course Title: Facilities Design in HPER

Prerequisites: None

Required for: REC & EXSS degree programs

New or Revised Catalog Course Description

Course will provide an introduction to planning, designing, architecture, budgeting, and construction of both indoor and outdoor facilities for PE, recreation, health, athletic training, gymnasiums, playing fields, etc. Design and construction areas such as aquatics, dance, ball fields, playgrounds, handicap accessibility, etc will be addressed.

Credit: 3 hrs

Change to be put into effect: Spring 2009

Course Title: Facilities Design in HPER

Course Code: LEC

Rationale: New course will strengthen both degree programs as well as satisfying ADA regulations.

5.5 New Course: Add new 3-hr course HLTH 3060 Human Sexuality as a degree requirement in the Health Promotion program (approved by Department 35-0-0).

Course Prefix & Number: HLTH 3060

Course Title: Human Sexuality

Prerequisites: None

Required for: Health Promotion degree program

Course Description

This course will provide the student with an examination of the physiological, psychological and sociological factors of human sexuality. Topics include social and biological foundations of human sexuality, human reproduction and contraception, cross-cultural perspectives on sexual behavior and society, gender roles, sexual stereotyping, issues in sex education, and the effects of various climates (economics, policy, politics, etc) on the expression of human sexuality.

Credit: 3 hrs

Course Title : Women's Health Issues

Topics will include, but are not limited to, the menstrual cycle, reproductive health and menopause, osteopenia and osteoporosis, the female athlete triad, female-specific illnesses including cancers, etc.
