In the absence of Chairman Labadie, Dr. Lisa Kelly called the meeting to order.

Dr. Kelly began by giving the committee members present an update on the daycare project. Dr. Kelly reported that the subcommittee had met and that steps had been taken to measure the interested in the project. Cammie Hunt added that Dr. Warren Baker with the School of Education had referred the subcommittee to Ms. Judith Losh, also with the School of Education for guidance. Ms. Losh recommended that the subcommittee conduct a needs assessment to determine if there is support for such a project and if so, how can we best serve the needs of our University community. Ms. Hunt went on to say that Ms. Losh has a Powerpoint presentation that she will be presenting at the next subcommittee meeting on March 29 if anyone is interested. Ms. Losh also plans to have copy of the needs assessment documents from both the Fayetteville State and the Fayetteville Technical Community College Centers.

Dr. Kelly then brought up several factors to consider with the project and with the assessment. She noted that students should have the first priority on space. She also stated that we need to consider factors such as age groups and rates.

At this time, Ms. Hunt made mention of a grant funded daycare center at UNCG. Attorney Payne asked if the UNCG center was totally grant funded. Ms. Hunt replied that it appeared that way. Attorney Payne noted that if our center was funded through grants that would tell us a great deal about what we can and cannot do in our planning stage.

Mrs. Fields then noted that at a recent meeting involving COMtech., a daycare center was mentioned in passing as being a part of that structure. She reported that it was implied that this potential daycare center was being constructed in partnership with UNCP. Mrs. Fields will follow up with COMtech. to determine the status.

After general discussion on the project, it was decided that the subcommittee will address the issue and report back to the full committee at the April meeting.

Dr. Jones then briefed the committee on other issues within Student Affairs. She reminded everyone that the University Marshall applications are due and asked that if anyone had students who might be interested, they be directed to GPAC. Dr. Jones went on to report that after

review, there would be no change in the time allotted between classes. She also updated the committee on the status of the new University Center Annex, the new student handbook and the increase in provider service hours at Student Health Services. Dr. Jones went on to report that our Miss UNCP is working hard in preparation for the Miss NC Pageant in June.

The meeting was then turned over to Nadean Hafner who reported on behalf of SGA that we should soon be seeing increased lighting around campus thanks to a \$45,000 upgrade project. She also reported that SGA has recently received a grant for recycling and that recycling bins will soon be in each dorm room. Nadean went on to say that SGA is looking into a campus transportation system that would ease the parking situation and provide transportation to any student within one mile of campus.

Being no further business, the meeting was adjourned at 3:10 p.m.
