## **1. Chair, Student Publications Board (Jamie Litty)**

- Yearbook student staff tabled at Grad Finale on Oct. 5 and 6 to give graduating seniors and grad students their complimentary pandemic-years yearbook, if the student was full-time F2F last year (i.e., paid for the yearbook in their student fees). Seniors who attended UNCP full-time in 2018-19 also received a copy of the 2018-19 book if they had never picked that up before.
- Yearbook student staff and students from Dr. Bak's public relations campaigns course tabled at Pembroke Day on Oct. 6 to distribute the pandemic-years yearbook to underclassmen who attended UNCP full-time F2F last year. They collected requests from alumni for older yearbooks. They allowed students to vote on the proposed themes for the upcoming yearbook. They collected applications from students for possibility of being a feature profile in the current book.
- The yearbook instructors collected three quotes for a yearbook vendor. Ended up going with the existing vendor for continuity's sake (19 years); it's Ms. Oswald's last year doing the yearbook and she already knows how to use this platform, which is all in the cloud these days.
- Dr. Emilia Bak's public relations campaigns class PRE 4600 is writing a survey of students about continued interest in the yearbook. Portrait-sitting is this week in the Annex.
- Pine Needle is sending 2 students to College Media Association annual conference this month in D.C., where one of them is a finalist for a photography prize, and keynote speakers are Woodward & Bernstein (in conjunction with Society of Professional Journalists).
