The Global Learning Community (GLC) is an on-campus residency/learning community for all students who want to live and study together learning about the language, the people, and culture of different countries. The Global Learning Community (GLC) will create a platform for international students and American students to interact and socialize on and off campus through sponsored activities of the two offices.

To celebrate the opening of the 2012/2013 Global Learning Community, the Office of International Programs will offer two \$500 scholarships for the fall 2012 semester. The first 50 students who apply to GLC will be automatically entered in the drawing for one of the scholarships. The second scholarship will be given to a student after the fall semester begins.

How do I join the GLC? You must apply and be accepted.



Pick up an application from International Programs and answer all the questions, sign and date it. Return it to International Programs. All members of the GLC will be housed in Courtyard Buildings 5 and 6. Why join the GLC? Here are a few reasons you may want to consider.

3. Develop a global perspective that helps promote cultural understanding.
4. Enjoy the sponsored events including two overnight excursions per semester with International Programs at a greatly reduced price per trip of less than \$100 that covers transportation and room. New Orleans, Louisiana (visit the world famous French Quarter)
Savannah, Georgia (stroll through this historic city)
