

Appendix 1 – UNC Pembroke Emergency Operations Plan Activation Levels

Activation Level	Event Description	University Response
LEVEL 3 Monitoring Activation	Minor incident that is quickly resolved with internal resources or limited help. <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Weather. • Infrastructure failure. • Minor injuries that occur on campus and do not require medical attention. • Thefts, break-ins. • Developing controversy or potentially disruptive issues. 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • No university wide action is required. • Emergency Operations Plan is activated. • Guarded conditions. • Notification will be made to those departments or areas and Emergency Support Functions who would need to take action as part of their everyday responsibilities.
LEVEL 2 Partial Activation	More significant emergency that impacts critical infrastructure, a building or multiple buildings and that may potentially affect life safety or mission-critical functions. <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Extended power outage. • Severe storms. • Major fire. • Contagious disease outbreak. • Domestic water contamination. • Bomb threat. • Serious damage to university facility(s). 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Emergency Operations Plan is activated. • All primary, or lead, Emergency Support Functions are notified. • The Emergency Operations Center will be staffed according to necessary emergency support functions. • Police and Public Safety determines the magnitude of the emergency and coordinates its resolution. • Chancellor’s cabinet may convene.
LEVEL 1 Full Scale Activation	A disaster that involves the entire campus and surrounding community. <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Tornado that causes significant damage. • Terrorism. • Serious community health emergency. • Active shooter. 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • The Emergency Operations Plan is activated. • Emergency Operations Center is fully activated. • Chancellor’s cabinet convenes. • Essential personnel across the campus mobilize.
